Warehouse use will be used to store recreational vehicles, travel trailers and other off-season recreational vehicles.

6. RECREATION AND COMMUNITY EVENTS

a. Update

At our last committee meeting, we discussed trailway and how to improve safety for all users. Staff will review most commonly used sections and make plans to address the trouble areas. Committee looking at introducing signage strategy

Unsafe use of trailway by some users of dirt bikes. If anyone witnessed dangerous activity, please report these issues to the RCMP who track complaints. Based on volume of complaints, they will increase patrols.

Our Fall Festival will be a go, based on public health restrictions, October 21-24. Programming is still being developed, but we will bring back our Harvest Hoedown.

Highland Park Slide- there was a delay experienced, we are still hoping to have it installed by September.

Installation of accessible swing with rubberized surface being installed. Inclusion is very importation for all our facilities.

Looking to identify space for fall programming. Other locations are being considered as community center is rented out.

Salmonier Line Plan Park plan is in draft and will be reviewed at next committee meeting, then released to the public.

7. INFRASTRUCTURE & PUBLIC WORKS

a. Update

Soccer Field Upgrades- contractor has sods placed on field, and multi-purpose to be finished in next couple weeks. It looks great.

2021 ditching contact is moving forward with work happening at: Brien's Road, Green Acres, North Side Road, Carrol's Road, McGrath's Road, Godson's Road, Bolands Pond, Beaver Brook Place.

Healey's Cove, some of North Side Road and Back Road have been completed.

Some culvert work has been completed – North Side Road, Veitch's Crescent, Kennedy's Lane.

b. Horizon Drive Road Upgrade

BE IT RESOLVED the Town of Holyrood approve upgrades to the Town owned road identified as Horizon Drive. The proposed improvements include 600 M of road upgrades to the entrance of the Industrial Park land as well as improvements to the intersection at Liam Hickey to improve public safety by correcting existing sight line deficiencies. The cost of \$341,540.81will be shared through a legal agreement with Blue Ocean Partners. The agreement identifies an expenditure of \$143,405.00 from Blue Oceans Partners and from the Town \$85,000.00 from the Industrial Park land sales and \$113,135.81 over the next 12 to 24 months accessed through future land sales.

f. Country Path Water system upgrade Change Order

BE IT RESOLVED Town of Holyrood approve Change Order 1, dated August 18,2021 for project 17-GI-20-00020 – Country Path Water Systems Upgrade in the amount of \$36,637.03. This change order is necessary due to changes in quantities resulting from mass amounts of unsuitable material in the excavation that could not be reused. This resulted in increases in an increased amounts of imported material and rock under bedding for the pipe. The cost of this change order is \$36,637.03, \$33,745.36 of which can be found in the approved project budget the \$2,891.67 overrun will be from the Town.
