# 4. MAYOR'S UPDATE

It has come to council's attention that we are having issues with large amount of household waste being left at outdoor garbage cans, specifically on the Salmonier Line. It is a fairly normal occurrence that

staff pick up a significant amount of garbage at these sites after each weekend. These garbage bins, which are just normal steel drums, are intended to be use for small amounts of garbage that one might have in their car like coffee cups and not a meant to be dumping site for people returning from their cabins or campers. We ask that any illegal dumping around these sites be reported to the town office. We all need to do our part to keep our town clean and tidy and activities like this surely don't achieve this goal.

Our large capital projects are progressing well. This spring we have started the water line upgrade project on Country Path and will soon commence the remediation work on the soccer field. These projects will help us to deliver reliable water service to country path and allow the upgrade to the soccer field that will make this site useable for our soccer program and other recreation events. These two projects that are ongoing have a combined price tag of close to \$1M and funded by various government cost sharing arrangements. We all look forward to these projects getting completed in the near future.

There are also other large capital projects that we hope to commence later this year that will also enhance the overall integrity of our water system. We are focused on the needs that our water system has but recognize all required projects cannot be completed in a short amount of time. Long term planning is required that will allow the town to properly allocate funds for these projects in the future.

Our request for a fair and reasonable bid will allow the Town to secure the services of Innovative Engineering to prepare a Prime Consultant Agreement and oversee the execution of the scope of work associated with this project.

This project will allow the Town to supply and install a 500,000-gallon water tank, installation of control systems and integration with the existing distribution system. It will provide the necessary water mains valves and boxes to connect to the existing system. This will allow the Town to provide reliable, continuous water access to residents.

There were all extremely qualified in their knowledge, skills and experiences and following the entire process. In the end we selected Evan Woodford to replace Fire Chief Bob Bauer while Bob attends to medical intervention and recovery. Evan's appointment is for 3 months and started today, May 25.

The town will be meeting Evan over the next few days and reviewing the logistics and all of the expected requirements of the Fire Chief position. In order for Evan to take the position of acting Fire Chief, we have hired Mark Maloney to replace Evan's position of fulltime fire fighter for the next 3 months.

Please join us in congratulating Mark and Evan on their positions.

While we wish Chief Bauer well, we also want to provide him with whatever support he needs to ensure he is given the time he needs to get well and to get himself back into a position where he is able to work. We do not plan to rush this in any way or put any additional pressure on Chief Bauer to return to work. His health and family come first. We wish Bob a speedy recovery.
