6. RECREATION AND COMMUNITY EVENTS

a. Update

Easter Camp was a success. We had the easter egg hunt and family movie. Active for Life and Zumba Gold is going ahead as planned and will see a 5-week spring session. Town will announce a date mid-

June for the Two-Hour tidy. Camp A'hoy registration is coming up on May 21. CBC United Soccer registration will be announced soon. The deadline for summer employment was today. Line up for the Beach Party is great. Tickets will be released in an Early Bird, General Admission and Gate Sales pending availability. No difference in prices.

BE IT RESOLVED the Town of Holyrood submit a gas tax application for \$100,000.00 to erect lighting on the Town's softball field. The cost of the lighting including installation of poles, lights and control box, and service is \$233,000.00 This initiative has been identified in the 2025 budget with support from the gas tax fund combined with the budgeted monies the Town will provide a softball field which can host professional and amateur sport events.

7. INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS

a. Update

Committee did not meet due to availability and conflicting schedules but we do have some updates.

Water Tank Upgrades- the RFP for design build was released last Friday, closing date is May 16.

Sewer Project- approval of the tender lease was issued yesterday, April 28. Tender involves cleaning of three components- the clarifier, oxidation ditch and holding tank. Tender should be released by April 30.

Salmonier Line Emergency Water Project- repaving the section that was affected by that project is going to start at the end of May.

Water Sustainability Project- quote for initial well testing was released by our consultant, CBCL and once we get those results, we will factor that into our next decisions.

Community Center- waiting on third and final concept design before we do open house consultation process. We hope to have that completed before Victoria Day weekend.

Festival Grounds- project has started. September 12 is project completion date.

Seasonal staff are back to work.

Green Sand Filter media is an important part of our water program to make sure we have safe, reliable drinking water. The replacement of the green sand has been completed and has been ongoing for the last 2 years. The shelf life for the filter media is 10 years.

I would like to recognize Mr. Matthew Penney as he retires at the end of this week after 23 years of service providing seasonal contribution to our public works department. He has been a valuable member of our team, and we wish him the very best in his well-deserved retirement.

8. EONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

a. Update

2 business applications reviewed and forwarded to Planning & Development.

RBC will reopen sometime in late 2025. They have put out notices in The Shoreline and in the mail.

NL Hydro is preparing the site for the new thermal plant. Valero has all the tanks removed and are working on the environmental clean-up.

There has been some vandalism in the Blue Ocean Industrial Park. This is the second incident in the last 2 months. The town is here to support however we can in moving forward and working with local authorities who are investigating.

9. PUBLIC SAFETY

a. Update

Cell service- Holyrood was chosen as one of the communities to see upgrades/enhancements of cell service.

It's Fire season and we have already had incidents. Town will distribute a safety message with all the other chiefs.

We are still waiting on a meeting with RCMP and Public Safety minister. Will update when we know something.

ATV's- I do not want to see a ban dirt bikes or ATV's in Holyrood. There are rules out there that everyone must follow. We have an issue on North Side Road and Kennedy's Lane. We need to find a

happy medium that respects the ATV/dirt bike user and the quality of life of residents. If we work together, we can come to a happy solution.

There were 3 promotions at the Fire Department over the last week. I want to acknowledge Lieutenant Brandy Ralph- who was promoted to the rank of Captain. Tanner Witty was promoted to lieutenant and Emily Boland was promoted to lieutenant.

The safety of the public and safety of the people using the trails and roads is our utmost priority. ATV's and Dirt bikes bring a lot to the community. We have to keep in mind that this is a shared trail.

Adventure Smart program is coming up on May 10 and will be held at the IBEW building. This is a recognized program put off by the Search and Rescue. Two programs- one for kids under 12 and one for 12 and up, including adults. Send an email to the town, or call the town, or show up that day. There is no cost to attend.

10.COMMUNICATIONS

a. Update

The Voyent alert system is underway. Training has been completed by staff. Encourage everyone to sign up. Marketing material will be put in the mail.

Communication Policy- we are putting a pause on the external policy. Still working on internal communications, maneuvering through. Still working our way through social media policy. We had a training session with new staff members. We gathered how people want to be informed in terms of external communication, and we will sit on that for a while and see if it's doing its job and what needs to be changed or fixed.

We are deactivating our Twitter/ accounts, following suit of other municipalities and government agencies. Wil use Facebook and Instagram for social media.

In the new municipalities act, committee meetings can be public and the public can attend. Will post on our website when they are going to occur. We also have working meetings which are in-camera sessions if we are discussing sensitive information. During these meetings there are minutes taken, and they must be published, adopted and accepted. All committee minutes will be adopted at a public meeting, and any recommendations have been approved.

Important that Council read all the committee minutes. Committee minutes will also be added to our website.

The assessment agency will be sending out assessment notices to residents in June. The MAA has employed drones and satellite imagery to capture every property that runs under the agency. This means that any work that has been done to your house has now been picked up, like fencing, garages, decks, patios pools, extensions, etc. When you receive your assessment to look at what has happened, it is up to you to check to see if it is valid and correct. If you have questions, you have to call the Municipal Assessment Agency. We will have the link to their website and a very detailed process if you want to appeal. Even before the appeal process, we implore you to call them.

We are going out to tender for a consultant to help with union negotiations.

In the quarterly review at the end of April, we will have a quarterly review of department expenditures and revenue.
