6. RECREATION AND COMMUNITY EVENTS

a. Update

Crystal Carnival was a huge success. Winter programs are up and running- Active for Life, Zumba Gold and Mini Movers. Squid Fest Beach party line up has been confirmed and will be held on July 19.

7. INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS

a. Update

Sewer Treatment Project and Water Tank upgrades- moving these along so we can execute during the construction season. Seeing some delays with department of environment but working with government to get this concluded.

Boland and Healey's Cove outfalls- review cost estimates and we are recommending that we monitor the outfall in 2025 and set aside a budget in 2026 for the clean out activity barring any unforeseen changes. Healey-s we will investigate and determine in the spring.

Water line extensions- application made to the town. Committee is developing criteria to be established and the director is working on that for consistency and standardization.

2005 Striling Dump Truck- disposal of asset- we set and appropriate reservice price and we want to get the maximum value possible. And if we don't get that we will postpone it to a future date.

Sewer line extension letter that was raised at the last public meetingwe discussed at the committee level, and we will be formulating a response to the residents.

Wastewater workshop being held in Gander March 26-27. The upgraded wastewater treatment facility will require qualified trained operators with a wastewater treatment operator certificate issued from the provincial government. This is a requirement under the town's wastewater permit to operate. Committee recommends proactive measures for continual education regarding water and wastewater training.

BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Holyrood approve the costs associated with the Director of Public Works and a member of the public works staff attend the 2025 Water & Wastewater Workshop sponsored by Department of Environment and Climate Change in Gander March 25 to March 27.

The cost includes hotel, travel & meals for a total of \$1,198.65. The event will consist of technical presentations and hands-on demonstrations covering various operation and maintenance activities and treatment options relating to community water and wastewater systems. This will enhance the Towns' ability to ensure procedures and processes regarding water and wastewater are up to date and integrated in the daily activities associated with both functions.

This is Fraud Prevention month. Be aware when receiving phone

calls, or showing up at your door. Check on elders and others who may not be aware.

Civic Address Concerns- St. John's Regional PSAP is aware of the challenge and are generally good at ensuring they collect and communicate information. The Fire Chief will engage the PSAP supervisor for a conversation on this topic and will ask that both PSAP's are made aware of the need for this information and it needs to be communicated to responding agencies in order to provide timely response. Ensure when giving your address, you say what town you are in due to multiple towns using Conception Bay Highway civic address.

Stress the importance of staying off the ice, there is no ice on the Avalon Peninsula that is safe right now.
